
Riverbend students opened the March Mudrooms storytelling event. All proceeds from the \$7 admission and treats were donated to the JAMM program.

Online Learning

Following mandated school closures, JAMM transitioned students to optional weekly lessons through Zoom. Students chose a "learning buddy" to share each lesson, keeping the student to teacher ratio low. Each Friday all JAMM students were invited to participate in a program-wide, live-Zoom session full of games, play alongs, scavenger hunts, and time to connect with friends.









New Programs and Partnerships in 2019-2020

Mudrooms: JAMM is thankful to have been selected as a Mudrooms beneficiary for 3 events this year. We are grateful for the support of Mudrooms and Mudroom patrons, and we look forward to participating in a third event, postponed for next year.

<u>Carnegie Hall</u>: Carnegie Hall invited JAMM into their Play USA cohort, providing funds and professional development for 17 after school music programs nationwide. JAMM has been invited to participate for two more years!

LA Philharmonic: Staff and teachers with the La Phil's Youth Orchestra of Los Angelas (YOLA) program participated in a teacher exchange with JAMM staff. JAMM and the LA Phil continue to develop this exciting opportunity.

String Group Lessons: To support middle and high school musicians JAMM provided free group lessons for upper strings and cello. This program will continue next year through the support of Carnegie Hall.

Free Summer Lessons: Funding from the Alaska Humanities Forum and City and Borough of Juneau, JAMM offered free, weekly lessons through Zoom for 1st grade through high school.

Mariachi: This fall Dzantiki Heeni Middle school started an after school Mariachi club featuring winds, strings, and vocals funded by JAMM.



Covid 19 Update 2020-2021: Challenge and Innovation

JAMM was able to transition from in-person programming to online lessons through Zoom for 2nd grade through high school. Every Friday students from all 3 elementary sites participated in additional live music sessions that included games, play alongs, and opportunities to chat with friends. Thanks to donor support, JAMM was able to continue offering tuition-free online instruction through May and through the summer.

Website: JAMM is working to add new materials and tools for online learning, free and accessible to anyone, any age, anywhere.

Zoom Group Lessons: Students will continue receive 90 minutes of exploratory and string instruction online this fall.

Home Visits: This fall JAMM staff will visit each 2nd-5th grade family at home to make sure students are prepared for online learning and to connect and get to know our families.

Leadership

From kindergarten, JAMM creates opportunities for peer mentorship, creativity, and confidence. Middle school musicians are invited to coach younger after school students. High school students are paid as teaching assistants to mentor youth and be JAMM representatives in the community.

Equity

All programming and instruments are free to students. JAMM has no registration deadline. Any student at a JAMM elementary site, and any student in middle or high school are welcome to participate in after school opportunities.

Partnership

JAMM's local and national partnerships keep programming financially efficient and help us utilize the most resources possible to support families and schools.

Inclusion

Through music curriculum and exploratory offerings JAMM works to be culturally inclusive and reflective of Juneau's cultural diversity.

Engagement

Students are seen as assets with the ability to do great things. Families are encouraged to participate from the beginning of their JAMM experience through paper violin making, and all students have opportunities to perform.

Service

All JAMM music curriculum integrates literacy and math skills, social emotional skills, leadership skills, and citizenship. JAMM helps develop adults members who will contribute to their community through the job force and civic engagement.
